The SPARCS project aims to develop solutions for energy positive districts in order to improve the climate friendliness of cities. But the implementation of technical measures to improve energy efficiency and to include renewables can only succeed if cities involve their citizens in the transformation process and motivate them to help shape it.

This database is intended to support cities in developing their own engagement strategies by briefly explaining a selection of engagement activities and providing further sources. The filters allow a selection according to the city's own goals or framework conditions.

Citizens' Councils

Objective: "The Vorarlberg Bürgerrat model, aka Citizens' Councils, was featured in OECD's report on Innovative Citizen Participation. Based on Jim Rough's Wisdom Council model, it aims to address community issues in a quick and inexpensive manner through facilitated deliberation" (www.participedia.net).

"The Vorarlberg Bürgerrat method generally involves the 4 steps described below.

Citizen Council: over the course of a day and a half, between 10 to 30 randomly selected citizens work out a joint statement (not open to the public). If there are more than 15 participants, the group is subdivided into two working groups. They carry out their work with the support of two moderators trained in <u>Dynamic Facilitation</u>.

Citizen Café: the findings of the Citizen Council are pre people attending. After some brief introductions by the smaller tables before reporting out to the larger group.

Explanation

1 Search Section

The Search section consists of eight different filter criteria on the left of the page. You can perform a filtered search to limit the number of results and find your preferred engagement activities more quickly.

You can at any time change the applied filter options and automatically receive the respective results.

A "Clear all" button on the top right of the "Filters" section appears as soon as a filter has been selected. By pressing it, you can immediately clear your filtered search and return to the full list of citizen engagement activities.

1.1 Title Search

The "Title contains" search bar accommodates a full-text search within the engagement activities' titles.

1.2 Participation level:

The filter criteria related to the different participation levels are implicitly connected with the aim of each engagement activity: The participation level describes the extent of involvement of the public in decision processes, starting with the basic information level, continuing with the consultation level, and then onto the collaboration level. This




